Dominique Reill's *The Fiume Crisis* recasts what we know about the birth of fascism, the rise of nationalism, and the fall of empire after World War I by telling the story of the three-year period when the Adriatic city of Fiume (today Rijeka, in Croatia) generated an international crisis. Reill achieves this novel account by examining how the people of Fiume tried to recreate empire in the guise of the nation.

Dominique Kirchner Reill is Professor of Modern European History at the University of Miami and author of the award-winning *Nationalists Who Feared the Nation: Adriatic Multi-Nationalism in Habsburg Dalmatia, Trieste, and Venice*.
